FROM YOUR PASTOR'S DESK

A preacher once told this story about the twenty third psalm -- a favorite of everyone. In a family gathering, a youngster stood up and recited the psalm from memory. It was a beautiful rendition. His words flowed like music. His parents applauded enthusiastically and asked him to do it a second time. He proudly obliged. Then the grandfather, the oldest member of the family, stood up. In a cracked and halting voice, he began, "The Lord is my shepherd. There is nothing I shall want..." His family sat there hypnotized till the conclusion. They were too overwhelmed to applaud. One in their company later summed up the reaction of all, "The boy knows the psalm, but the old man knows the shepherd."

In the Old Testament, the image of the Shepherd is often applied to God as well as to the leaders of the people. The book of Exodus represents Yahweh several times as a shepherd. The prophets Isaiah and Ezekiel compare Yahweh's care and protection of His people to that of a shepherd. "He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against His breast and leading the mother ewes to their rest" (Is. 40:11). Ezekiel represents God as a loving shepherd who searches diligently for the lost sheep. Psalm 23 is David's famous picture of God as The Good Shepherd: "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I lack. In green pastures you let me graze, to safe waters you lead me." The prophets often used harsh words to scold the selfish and insincere shepherds (or leaders) of their day. Jer 23:1: "Doom for the shepherds who allow the flock of my pasture to be destroyed and scattered." Ez 34: 2: "Trouble for the shepherds of Israel who feed themselves! Shepherds ought to feed their flock."

Jesus adds two more roles to those of the good shepherd. He goes in search of stray lambs and heals the sick ones. Jesus heals the wounds of our souls through the sacrament of Reconciliation and strengthens us in illness and old age with the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Jesus dies for his sheep: Just as the shepherds of ancient days protected their sheep from wild animals and thieves by risking their own lives, so Jesus died in expiation for the sins of all people.

Through today's gospel, Jesus teaches one of the central aspects of the ministerial priesthood: the priest as shepherd. It means that a priest is one who, by his consecration, lives for others. The title, "Father", like the title, "Shepherd," expresses a relation of loving service to others, from the most sacred ministries to the most trivial chores. Every one who is entrusted with the care of others is a shepherd. Hence pastors, parents, teachers, doctors, nurses, government officials, etc. are all shepherds. We become good shepherds by loving those entrusted to us, praying for them, spending our time and talents for their welfare, and guarding them from physical and spiritual dangers. Parents must be especially careful of their duties by giving good example to their children.

Though nothing substantial has been done on parish level, during this YEAR OF PRIESTS, I was touched by the gestures of a very few people who sent me cards and Spiritual Bouquets! Very few people know we priests need your prayers too, not just criticisms and evaluations!

Thank you for being there for me and loving me overlooking my imperfections.

SAINT CATHERINE OF SIENA (1347-1380) - April 29



Imagine the pope receiving a young woman still in her twenties who addresses him as “my sweet Christ on earth,” then orders: “Get back to Rome where you belong!” Amazingly, Gregory XI complied! Yet this was but one astonishing incident in the extraordinary life of Catherine of Siena, a truly unique medieval woman. Youngest of twenty-five children, Catherine refused marriage and became a Dominican Tertiary at sixteen, cloistering herself at home in contemplative prayer, austere penances, and mystical experiences, culminating in “spiritual espousal” to Christ. Then, incarnating the Dominican ideal of “passing on to others the fruits of contemplation,” Catherine left her solitude to care for the poor, nurse the sick, comfort the dying, and bury the dead. Increasingly renowned for converting souls and healing bodies, she was sought after to broker peace during civil wars and Church schisms. All this, and like Jesus, whom she called “my “Divine Spouse,” she died at thirty-three! Four hundred letters and her spiritual classic *The Dialogue* inspired Paul VI to name her, together with Teresa of Ávila, the first women “doctors of the Church.”
