## FROM YOUR PASTOR'S DESK

John Ford's superb family action adventure "Wee Willie Winkie" (1937), is loosely based on Rudyard Kipling's popular story from his "Tales of British India." The setting of this movie is 19<sup>th</sup> century British-occupied India. Little Priscilla Williams and her widowed mother travel to India to live with their relative, Colonel Williams, the colonel at a British Army base in India, an oppressive place, ruled with an iron fist by Colonel Williams. Priscilla is a very curious, precocious child, who gains the nickname of "Private WEE WILLIE WINKIE." The little girl quickly charms everyone around her, including a tough Scots Sergeant. After a series of adventures, she wins the hearts of everyone by challenging the prejudicial assumptions of both friends and enemies. Her innocent, yet challenging questions are instrumental in helping Colonel Williams and Islamic freedom fighter, Khoda Khan, to see the senselessness of violence. This leads them to a negotiated peace. Today's gospel assures us that it is the abiding presence of God the Father and God the Holy Spirit within us, with the Risen Lord, which gives us lasting peace.

Jesus gives his followers four gifts: First, he gives them his love, which will enable them to keep his word. Next, he gives them the Holy Spirit, who will teach them everything they need to know. The Holy Spirit is the abiding love of God available to us, enabling us to accept the friendship of Jesus, while imitating Him, the Master. Third, he gives them his peace to strengthen them against fear in the face of trouble. Here "peace" is not just the absence of conflict, but also the far wider concept of *shalom*, the total well-being of the person and community.

According to a new Associated Press Economy Survey, two-thirds of the 44 economists surveyed said they believed the last recession had created a "new frugality" among consumers that will outlive the recession. The danger they say is a desire to save more could also act as a drag on spending going forward.

In the Divine Economy, God says the same. He asks each of us a question. Do you have time for me? Are you too frugal to spend a few minutes of your time, talent and treasure for me, when I go on giving you? How much you love me and my bride--the Church?

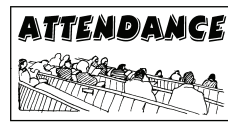





## Council Meeting Minutes

Tues., April 20, 2010

The meeting opened with a prayer by Albert Domm. The minutes of the last meeting were approved by the attendees. There were no outstanding actions to review.

It was agreed that the next meeting would include a preliminary review of options for a Parish event like previous picnics.

The primary discussion for this meeting centered around a review of the recommendations proposed by the Ministry Review Committee. It was remarked that a tremendous amount of work and thought had been made by the Ministry Committee in preparing the evaluation and report.

It was agreed by all that there was a great deal of work to be completed to address the issues raised by the report. The council agreed to work through the issues on a priority basis to ensure that proper attention was given to all aspects of the proposal. It was further agreed that work committees would be assigned individual aspects to increase the efficiency of the reviews. It is critical to ensure that the proper resources are in place to be able to effectively complete this undertaking.

Three committees were established at this meeting to start the rebuild process. The first committee (Jack MacMillan) will confirm all of the resources that will be available to the Council for the coming evaluations. The second committee (Al Domm and Deacon Keller) will evaluate Parish Council By-Laws and training models already in place throughout the Diocese. The third committee (Claire Keller, Anne Domm, Dalia Grajeda, and Lynn Reed) will propose a timeline for the priority of activities to address the issues together with goal for this project.

In light of the restructuring work necessary to address the issues, the Council has postponed Council elections until January 2011.

A reminder was given to all regarding the upcoming Stewardship Meeting for May 2<sup>nd</sup> at 11:30 am. All were urged to participate.

The meeting was closed with a prayer led by Jack MacMillan.

### UNIQUELY YOU

We may think only special people have a vocation, either to the priesthood or religious life. The fact is that each baptized Christian has a vocation to be a disciple of Jesus. Baptism is the beginning of each Christian vocation—in other words, the *why* of being a Christian—while stewardship is the *how*. Here in our parish community, refracted through the prism of all our individual vocations, is a way of life embodying and expressing the one mission of Christ: to do God's will, to proclaim the Good News of salvation, to heal the afflicted, to care for one another, to live life to the fullest as Jesus did. Fortunately, we do not have to do this by our own efforts. As Jesus assures us in today's Gospel, there is help. The strength of the Holy Spirit fills the hearts of all who love the Lord and follow in his way. The call to live this way is urgent. Jesus does not tell us to follow him some time in the future, or whenever we feel like it. The moment is now.
